STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

The student is advised that a notice of cancellation shall be in writing, and that a withdrawal will be effectuated by the student's written notice or by the student's conduct, including but not necessarily limited to, a student's lack of attendance. If mailed in, the cancellation note becomes effective as of the postmark if properly addressed with proper postage. You will receive a complete refund within 30 days of course cancellation. You must return all equipment and materials to the school within the 30 days cancellation period, or the cost of the equipment and materials will be deducted from your refund.
